Misty Ladd:

Ms. Ladd addressed the Board and requested their review and approval of the curriculum for a Private Investigation school she and her partner would like to start. The proposed school has been approved by the State Board of Private Career Education.

Craig Russell made a motion to approve the school. This motion was second by Kevin Sanders and carried unanimously.

Pinnacle Security:

Re: Request for approval of ESA Understanding Alarm Systems training certification in lieu of ESA Level 1 training certification. Michelle Thomas, with Pinnacle Security submitted a request to the Board to accept the Understanding Alarm Systems course. The Board was advised that the Understanding Alarm Systems course is 7 hours and the Level 1 is 22 hours. The Board chairman, Jordon Brown, further advised that Understanding Alarm Systems is not a course for technicians.
